

Local Flavors Serving Deliciousness with a Side of Kindness: Panchito's Restaurant

Panchito's, owned by Jeanie Deleon Diaz, has been serving the **Rio Grande Valley** since 2001. They are a single location, familyowned, curbside-only restaurant serving breakfast and lunch. Their food is made with the finest, locally sourced ingredients, keeping their money in our community. Customer favorites include: fideo loco

and the botana for two (2) featuring nachos, fajitas, smoked sausage, quesadillas, and all the fixings. But they don't just serve Mexican food. They also feature croissant sandwiches. southwest chicken wraps made with homemade spinach tortillas, chicken and dumplings, broccoli cheese soup, lasagna soup with garlic toast, and more.

When other restaurants shut down

during the pandemic, Panchito's switched to curbside only. They continue to serve customers curbside exclusively, to ensure the health and wellness of their 74-year-old grandmother, who is the cook.

When Ms. Diaz's grandfather was alive, he would grace Panchito's with a weekly visit. Although Ms. Diaz would never accept payment for his food, even when he insisted, stammering, "business is business." Her response would be, "family is everything." In his honor, Panchito's provides and takes care of the older generation in the Harlingen community by offering free delivery. Panchito's delivered warm, delicious food to my

delicious food to my parents when they were older and no longer able to drive, and my family truly appreciated it.

Ms. Diaz is such a wonderful and giving person who constantly lifts others up with her generosity and positive vibes. Even after facing adversity such as frequent vandalizations, reduction in staff, and a stage 4 cancer diagnosis for Ms. Diaz's sister, the Diaz family continues to give back to the community. Sure, there will be less money in your pocket right now, but it will also help your business grow, ultimately allowing you to quit your day job and focus solely on running your business.

The last Friday of each month on "A" Street in Harlingen is home to a routine created by creatives to bring people closer to different arts. It's called Harlingen Art Night, and it's a monthly arts appreciation event highlighting local vendors.

"I think it is an opportunity for

anybody to come out and showcase their art," Souther Recio, owner of Cactus Valley Art & Supply Co. on Van Buren Avenue in Harlingen, said over the phone. "It's an opportunity for our community, neighbors, to meet one another."

Harlingen Art Night brings hundreds of people to see and shop for fine art, candles, and stones. More than

20 vendors set up from sunset to dark (7 pm to 10 pm), while local art studios and bars stay open for Art Night goers to visit.

Many characters visit Harlingen Art Night: from local actors dressed in costume for the Harlingen Community Theatre Wizard of Oz production to promote the performances to vendors selling pinned insects and folks dressing as memes on Halloween weekend.

"Watching the vendors progress and seeing their growth in confidence ... it's just nice to see their growth in their determination and talent," Mia Garza, the co-organizer for Harlingen Art Night said over the phone. "Once you start selling, it's validating and inspires artists to create more."

Since its inception nearly 10 years ago in January 2014, Harlingen Art Night has evolved and opened doors for a community to establish new small businesses. In fact, the Harlingen Economic Development

Corporation recently noted that Site Selection magazine named Harlingen as one of the Top 50 Best Small Cities for Small Business in the United States.

"I have a wide variety of clientele," Salma de Leon, owner of Little Lami's Shop who has been a Harlingen Art Night vendor approximately 50 times, said over the phone. "I've had more people come up to me at Art Night than any other place I've been to and it's returning customers."

Harlingen Art Night occurs on the last

Friday of the month from 7 pm to 10 pm on "A" Street between Jackson and Monroe. Vendors sign up online via Google forms and pay a \$5 fee in person for their spot. Contact Harlingen Art Night on Instagram (@ harlingenartnight) for more information. •

2023 Year in Review: Coffee, Restaurants, and More Places to Shop

2023 was a big year for new businesses opening in Harlingen. Since January, I have been tracking and sharing new business openings on my Explore Harlingen community page on Facebook. Although the majority of what I tracked were restaurants, Harlingen did see a few retailers open locations this year, with national chain, Academy Sports and Outdoors, as one of the biggest and most exciting store openings in recent Harlingen history. Their newly constructed location at 2831 W. Expressway

83 in the Harlingen Corners shopping center (next to Five Below), celebrated its grand opening weekend November 17-19, 2023, with its soft opening for friends and family starting on November 12, 5-9 pm. Other new retailers that came to Harlingen

this year included

Ollie's Bargain Outlet, a national discount closeout retailer, which opened on January 25 at Valle Vista Mall. Seasonal national store, Spirit Halloween, opened on August 12 at its temporary location at 1106 S. Expressway 83 and closed after Halloween.

Several coffee shops

opened in Harlingen this year, giving some healthy competition to Starbucks. Two national chains, Dutch Bros Coffee, which opened on June 30, and Scooter's Coffee, which opened on August 13, brought their well-known offerings to Harlingen. Dutch Bros demolished the building at 1601 W. Harrison to create their brand-new drive thru only shop, while Scooter's Coffee constructed a new building for their drive-thru only shop at 2304 S. 77 Sunshine Strip.

Additionally, several small coffee shops opened this year including:

• 4 Dogs Roasting, which offers coffee and tea accessories and gifts, opened on February 9 at 108 W. Jackson.

Sovereign Coffee, of Brownsville, opened its second Rio Grande Valley (RGV) location in Harlingen on March 2 at 1733 S. 77 Sunshine Strip.
Sparrows Sip & Thrift, a hybrid coffee shop and thrift store, opened in mid-August at 406 E. Harrison.

• Tora Coffee & Tea, of Brownsville, opened its second location in Harlingen on September 29 at 620 W. Van Buren Ave. In addition to coffee, Harlingen added several places for its residents to eat this year, including: • Ricardo's Restaurant, which has several locations throughout the RGV, opened on March 13 at 3201 S. Expressway 83, Unit C.

• Jersey Mike's Subs, a national submarine sandwich shop, opened on March 22 at 2217 W. Lincoln.

• Brady's Grill, a locally owned restaurant from La Feria, moved to Harlingen on May 6 at 610 Lewis Lane (however, they have since moved to San Antonio).

• Mariscos Tulum, a Mexican seafood restaurant, opened on June 13 at 102 N. 77 Sunshine Strip.

• Papas & Papas, a restaurant featuring build-your-own potatoes and potato tacos, opened on August 9 at 6704 W. Expressway 83, Suite D108.



Jackson in downtown Harlingen,

held its soft opening on November 18. The Moon Rock, Harlingen's food truck park at 1811 W. Jefferson Ave., saw the arrival of two new trucks this year: a gourmet sandwich truck, Hatter's Sammiches, which opened on August 16, and Teddy's Barbecue of Weslaco, which launched its Harlingen food truck on August 25.

A new local bar also opened in Harlingen this year. DRINK UP



Notable Nonprofits RGVHS: Saving Lives, One Animal at a Time

The Rio Grande Valley Humane Society (RGVHS) is a non-profit 501(c)3, community animal shelter based in Harlingen, with a second location in Mission. RGVHS serves more than 6,000 animals each year, either brought in by municipal animal control officers or surrendered by local residents.

A Leader Steps Down

The RGVHS Board

of Directors announced on November 20, 2023, that executive director Luis Quintanilla resigned after nearly four years in the position. Melissa Saldana has been appointed interim executive director.

Mr. Quintanilla came to RGVHS in February 2020 when the shelter, previously known as the Humane Society of Harlingen, used to euthanize 85 percent of the animals that came into the shelter. RGVHS board president, Lillian Cantu Kim reflected, "His passion and commitment to the animals and the community transformed the animal shelter (in Harlingen) from a high-volume euthanasia shelter to a no-kill shelter." Mrs. Kim continued, "This transformation is the legacy that he leaves behind. It won't be forgotten."

From February 21, 2020, through November 20, 2023, during Mr. Quintanilla's tenure, RGVHS saved 10,719 homeless cats and dogs. Under Mr. Quintanilla's leadership, RGVHS has received national recognition due to the following accomplishments:

• Animal adoptions: 7,882

Animals transferred to rescue partner: 3,888
Animals reunited with owner: 1,520

• Community cats returned to field: 2,358

• Animals fostered: 5,948

Spay/neuter surgeries performed: 8,783
Animals served through monthly community clinics:

15,725

• Save rate for 2022: 94.3%

• Animals killed for space: 0

It is the RGVHS' hope that they can continue to build upon the strong foundation that Mr. Quintanilla created as they move forward into 2024.

Ways RGVHS Supports the Community

Currently, RGVHS hosts monthly community clinics at both their Harlingen

in recognition of achieving no-kill status during calendar year 2022 by exceeding a 90% save rate for cats and dogs.

and Mission locations. At these clinics, RGV residents can receive discounted vaccinations and medications for their pets, such as rabies, Bordetella, dewormer, flea/tick preventative, heartworm preventative, and more.

Because spaying and neutering pets is strongly recommended to help limit the pet population, RGVHS provides low-cost spay and neutering services at a fraction of the cost that you would pay at a veterinary office.

Ways the Community Can Support RGVHS

There are many ways that the community can

help RGVHS with their mission. Donations are always welcomed. You can drop off frequently needed items such as blankets, towels, dog and cat food, paper towels, and newspapers. Or you can donate a set amount every month with the monthly giving program on their website, www.rgvhs. org/956champions. Event sponsorships help the RGVHS continue its lifesaving efforts. The RGVHS' biggest fundraiser, the Wine and Whiskers gala, is set for April 6, 2024.

Additionally, RGVHS continuously needs fosters to help free up space at the shelter and place animals in homes, even if temporarily. They also accept volunteers. This past summer, my daughter volunteered weekly to read to the kittens at **RGVHS**. We became so enamored with the cats and kittens that we decided to fosterto-adopt a little brown tabby kitten named Cindy Clawford after our beloved dog had

passed away. We ultimately adopted Cindy, and she helped us tremendously with the grieving process with her loving yet spunky personality.

The RGVHS in Harlingen is located at 1106 Markowsky Ave., and is open 7 days a week, with extended hours of 11 am to 6 pm (regular business hours are 1 pm to 6 pm). 
