

Harlingen to Elect Cover Three City Positions this

November

On November 4. citizens of Harlingen will elect three city positions: Mayor (at-large), City Commission District 1, and City Commission District 2.

Norma Sepulveda, Mayor of Harlingen since May 2022, is running for a second consecutive term. unopposed.

City Commission District 1

Current Commissioner Ford Kinsley made an official announcement on Facebook on June 6 that he had decided not to seek re-election.

Two candidates for City Commission District 1 will be on the November 4 ballot. A third candidate, John Lane, had applied for candidacy and attended the drawing for his place on the ballot on August 26; however, on September 12, he informed Explore Harlingen that he had decided to drop out of the race.

Explore Harlingen asked each candidate to summarize his or her goals if elected.

Butternut Squash Recipes Butternut Squasn with Smoked Apple Sausage and Ground Beef

Happy October! Let's make a dish full of fall flavors together; a meal so good it'll scare the hunger out of you.

Ingredients:

- Large butternut squash
- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1 package of smoked apple sausage
- Pinch of salt and pepper
- Tsp. garlic powder
- Large skillet
- Baking dish
- ½ cup chunks of Parmesan cheese
- Handful of spinach

Instructions:

- 1. Let's start by preheating the oven to 375 degrees.
- 2. Get your baking dish out. Slice the

- butternut squash in half. Salt and pepper each side.
- 3. Place the squash in the baking dish into the oven at 375 degrees for 45-50 minutes.
- 4. In a skillet put the stovetop on medium to high heat.
- 5. Add ground beef and cook it for 7 minutes. Once browned, add the smoked apple sausage. Sprinkle salt, pepper, and garlic powder all over the meat.
- 6. While the beef

- mixture is cooking, get a handful of spinach and dice it.
- 7. With a fork, poke the middle of the butternut squash to be sure it's baked through and tender. Now add a handful of the Parmesan cheese, top it with the meat we iust made and the remainder of the cheese, then top with the spinach.

This is a simple and delicious recipe. I hope you give it a try and enjoy it as much as my family and I have. Happy

Dreaming Big

We've all heard the saying, "Build your own dream, or someone else will hire you to build theirs." It's easier said than done, but after 15 years as a manager of a Mexican restaurant, Alejandra knew it was time to take the leap from employee to owner.

As for most people, 2020 was a year of serious reflection for Alejandra and her husband Marko Esparza. The impact that Covid had on employees was eye opening. And with the couple expecting their first child, they You Say Potato, I Say Papa

knew they wanted the security and flexibility of building something of their own to pass down to the next generation.

Alejandra started working in restaurants when she was only 15 years old. She knew the ins and outs of the food industry, and Marco (an artist by trade) channeled that same creativity in the kitchen. Together they make the perfect team.



Marco was born in Chicago, but his parents were originally from Monterey, Mexico, where papas are everywhere! This got them thinking, how can we bring potatoes

onto the menu, but add that Rio Grande Valley (RGV) flavor to them? Answer: Make them BIGGER and top them with the RGV's favorite local foods! So that's exactly what they did. And just like that, La Papa Loca went from a dream to a reality.

location. Figuring out where to set up shop can be a challenge, but thankfully things lined up perfectly for Alejandra and Marco in this department. Before opening, they had been in contact with the owner of the Moon Rock, when the food truck park was just breaking ground in Harlingen. The timing was perfect, and they started their journey together.

The Menu

La Papa Loca specializes in loaded baked potatoes, but it's not the only thing they serve. I had the opportunity to swing by and enjoy some of their best-selling menu items as well as a papa from their "secret menu." More about that later!

From signature baked potatoes loaded with fajita, sausage, and even

The Snack Menu is perfect for an appetizer or finger foods you can share while enjoying a drink and some live music. Speaking of drinks, make sure you grab one of the freshly squeezed lemonades to wash down all that deliciousness.





















Moves, Adds, and

called The Harlingen Police Education and Community Fund. They coordinate three charity events throughout the year with this 5K run being the second event of the year (the first is the CBA State **BBQ** Championship in June; the third is the upcoming "Shop with a Cop" discussed further in this article).

In the past, about 400 runners have attended the event and Bravo says they hope to have as many participants this year. The first 400 to cross the finish line will receive a finisher's medal, which is usually handed out by a local

first responder.

"Since it's called Run with the Heroes put on by us, the Harlingen Police Department, we reach out to other police agencies and federal agencies and first responders... and they help us put on this event, they assist us and we make it happen," he said.

Bravo also commented on how, not only do first responders take part in the event by cheering on runners at the finish line, but some also even run alongside

participants in their uniforms and all. From

SWAT team members to firefighters wearing their uniform including their tanks, Bravo said it's definitely something that isn't seen every day.


"It's a pretty neat thing that goes on," he said. "We do encourage all law enforcement to attend. I know a bunch of our Harlingen Police Officers do take part in the run."

The event will begin at 7:30 am with Jo-Jo of FM 100 KTEX, the emcee, making announcements and introductions of the chief of police and Make-A-Wish.

The \$35 registration fee includes a running shirt. This year, the first 250 runners who sign up for the race will also snag a pair of custom socks. The

knee-high socks feature the Harlingen Police Department badge logo and an American flag. The registration fee is discounted at \$30 for first responders and children 14 years and younger. There will also be 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place trophies for the top three runners in seven age divisions.

The Harlingen Police Department stays busy throughout the year with several other community and charity events. The next charity event coming up during the holiday season is "Shop with a Cop," an initiative that, in partnership with Harlingen Consolidated Independent School District (HCISD), benefits 85 HCISD students from financially unsecured

homes. It allows these students to go on a shopping spree with a police officer right around the holidays as well as receive a fully cooked meal for Thanksgiving.

"We are definitely very busy throughout the year, especially from September through the end of the year... it's busy, busy," Bravo said, referencing trunk or treats, national nights out, and other events the city puts on.

In the meantime, Bravo invites the public to come out and support the race.

"Join in with the first responders and support

RGV Down Syndrome Nonprofits Association:

Empowering and Educating for

a Better World

The Rio Grande Valley Down Syndrome Association (RGVDSA) provides connection. support, and advocacy for individuals with Down syndrome and their loved ones across the RGV. At the center of this effort is Deborah Tomai, the organization's president and co-founder, whose personal journey as a mother led to the creation of a lifeline for families like hers.

Deborah and her family had been living in the RGV for just two years when her youngest child, Ben, was born and diagnosed with Down syndrome.

Down syndrome is a genetic condition. People with Down syndrome may face health challenges or developmental differences, but with support and opportunity they can lead full, meaningful lives.

"I had a lot of questions about what the diagnosis would mean for Ben's life, what it would mean for our family, and I wanted to be a good mom. I wanted him to have a great life, and I just had a lot of questions about how that was going to work," she recalled.

In her search for answers, Deborah was referred to a case manager to connect with other families in the area

who had children with Down syndrome. "A

couple of us all started calling each other... and it gave me a lot of hope." That connection sparked the beginnings of the RGVDSA.

In March of 2021, Deborah and her new community of support decided to help spread awareness. One of the group's earliest public events—the Step Up for

Down Syndrome Walk—revealed how much the RGV needed such an organization. "We really were hoping we'd have a couple hundred people there... We ended up having over 1,000 people come, and we had 60 families who had kids or adult family members with Down syndrome sign up. It was amazing and beautiful," Deborah said.

From its inception, RGVDSA has focused on building relationships, advocating for inclusion, and supporting individuals with Down syndrome and their families throughout the RGV. The organization works to show that people with Down syndrome are valued members of the community, with talents and contributions worth celebrating and recognizing.

The association offers a wide range of resources for families, starting from the moment of diagnosis. "We really want families to feel celebrated," Deborah said, noting that the organization provides a congratulations basket to families, including information and resources in both English and Spanish. The organization also connects families through a private Facebook group, where members can share advice,

celebrate milestones, and support one another.

RGVDSA's programs and activities continue

to expand. In addition to the annual Step Up for Down Syndrome Walk, the group hosts classes, playdates, and even a theater program. "We have a group of adults with Down syndrome performing in a play inspired by Alice in Wonderland this year," Deborah said.

Despite its success, the organization faces challenges. Being entirely volunteer-run makes it hard for families to stay consistently involved, and serving members spread across the RGV can be tricky. Looking ahead, Deborah has big plans. "In the next five years, we'd love to have staff and a space where families can gather for teen nights, tutoring, or

new-mom meetups," she said.

For now, the association continues to lean on the RGV community for support. Volunteers are always welcome, especially for major events, like the Step Up for Down Syndrome Walk, which will take place on

October 18 at Edinburg Municipal Park. "You can reach out on our Facebook page... and we'll connect you for volunteering," Deborah encouraged.

Through this network, families find guidance, friendship, and a place to celebrate milestones together. The Rio

Artist of

Serkit Studios: the Month Painting Culture

Across South Texas

Adrian Rodriguez remembers drawing since elementary school. It wasn't until about 18 years ago that he started painting.

"I was mostly just drawing for fun. I never took art class in school. I was just drawing on my own. I took my first art class in college, and that's when it first clicked that that was something I could do," Rodriguez said.


The Edinburg artist, whose specialty is airbrushing and murals, dedicates himself to his art full-time, having left teaching a year ago after eight years as an educator. While a teacher at Port Isabel Junior High School, Rodriguez left his mark at the campus with two murals that students painted under his direction.

"I drew the whole thing and designed the murals with the help of the students. We painted together," he said.

Rodriguez also earned the District Teacher of the Year distinction for the 2021-2022 school year for Point Isabel Independent School District.

He has done murals from South Padre Island all the way to Mission with his newest piece having just been unveiled in the downtown area of Harlingen in August.

The mural, which

took about a month to paint with sketching and deliberation on design happening two weeks prior to that, is an achievement for Rodriguez, who also goes by his artist name "Serkit."

When asked how it feels to have his artwork in the city of Harlingen, he said it is amazing.

"I've thought about doing it (a mural in the downtown Harlingen area) for like ten years. Every time I went to Art Night or Market Days, I always thought about having a mural (there)... I thought about it so much, and it came true," he said.

The mural, which is reminiscent of vintage-

style linen postcards of the 1930s through the 1950s, has a different scene or element of the city in each letter like the Iwo Jima monument or the Jackson Street sign. It is located on North Commerce Street.

Rodriguez draws inspiration from Mexican American culture and the Pre-Columbian era.

"I also like fantasy and

sci-fi type of art like Frank Frazetta," he said.


One of the biggest challenges Rodriguez has had to face as an artist who is dedicated fulltime to his craft, has been turning his talent into a business.

"That's been tough. It's not easy. It took me a long time to build the skills to airbrush and paint big murals and try to get paid for it," he said.

As for what the future holds for Rodriguez, he'd like to venture out beyond the Valley. "I need to apply for bigger mural jobs, bigger cities outside of the Valley," he said.

In the meantime, you can catch him at the Pulga de Alamo or city of Alamo flea market on Saturday and Sunday. There, he airbrushes shirts, pants, jackets and hats for customers. He also works out of his home studio and can airbrush other items like helmets, leather, automotive parts, "almost anything" as Rodriguez puts it.

The NFL Dream is Sports Alive in Harlingen

The 2025 NFL season has begun, with all 32 teams aiming to become the 2026 Super Bowl Champions. For the winners it will be a dream come true, and for their fans, it will give them a year of bragging rights.

As I reflected on the start of the 2025 NFL season, I wondered if my beloved Dallas Cowboys would ever make it back to the Super Bowl again. I, also, reflected on how special it must be to make it to the NFL as a player.

Playing in the NFL must be the ultimate achievement for anyone who loves American football. For those athletes, who have the God-given talent to make it in the NFL, this achievement must be a dream come true.

As a Harlingen resident, I know that we have had some Harlingen Cardinals experience the NFL dream and I began to wonder how many players from the Rio Grande Valley (RGV) have played in the NFL.

I did some internet research and discovered that the Greater Harlingen area seems to have produced the most NFL players in the RGV. The McAllen area and Weslaco have had two (2) NFL players each while Brownsville has had one (1) NFL player; however, our beautiful Harlingen community and its surrounding area have produced a whopping seven (7) NFL players.

Although all the RGV football players who have made it to the NFL make us proud, this article focuses on the seven (7) amazing individuals from the Harlingen area who made it to the NFL.

Jim Hudson (La Feria)

The most senior NFL player from the Harlingen area is La Feria Lion, Jim Hudson.

Jim excelled at multiple sports in high school and was the Class 2A State Discus Champion, but it was his versatility to play multiple positions on the gridiron that earned him a roster spot with the University of Texas Longhorns in the early 1960s. Jim's ability to play multiple positions, especially on defense, helped contribute to the Texas Longhorns football team success culminating with a win the 1963 National Championship game against Navy.

Jim went on to play for six seasons with the New York Jets winning a Super Bowl Championship in 1969 when the New York Jets, with Quarterback Joe Namath, beat the heavily favored Baltimore Colts. Jim's career is extremely impressive and unique.

Not too many athletes can say that they won championships at the state, college, and professional levels but, La Feria Lion Jim Hudson can.

After retiring from football, Jim and his business partner operated a very successful real estate firm in Austin,

Dale Hellestrae (Harlingen)

The next NFL player from our area is Dale Hellestrae who played only one year of football at the Marine Military Academy (MMA) in 1983.

After dominating at MMA, Dale earned a football scholarship to play at Southern Methodist University (SMU). Dale was a twoyear starter at SMU as an offensive tackle and earned All Southwest Conference honors.

Dale was selected by the Buffalo Bills in the 12th round of the 1985 NFL draft. After three (3) seasons with the Buffalo Bills, Dale played one season with the Los Angeles Raiders before being traded to the Dallas Cowboys in 1990. Dale spent 11 seasons with the Dallas Cowboys excelling as the Cowboys special team's long snapper and played in 176 consecutive games. Dale became one of the best long snappers in the NFL and in Dallas Cowboys' history. Dale was a pivotal member of his team and helped the Dallas Cowboys win three (3) Super Bowl Championships in the 1990s. Dale completed his career in 2002 after one season with the Baltimore Ravens.

Dale continues his involvement with football as an analyst on professional and NCAA football games for college football on Versus and serves as a co-host of the weekly "Jacob and Helly in the Morning" on AM & FM radio in the Arizona area.

Roberto Garza (Rio Hondo)

Another great NFL player from our area is Rio Hondo Bobcat Roberto Garza. After a successful high school career competing in football and track and field, Roberto chose to walk on at Texas A&M Kingsville.

Roberto not only made the Javelina football team, but he had a very successful four-year football career at Texas A&M Kingsville as an offensive lineman.

In 2001, Roberto was selected by the Atlanta Falcons as the 99th overall pick in the 4th round of the NFL draft. Roberto spent five seasons with the Atlanta Falcons and then signed to play for the Chicago Bears in 2005.

Roberto spent 10 seasons with the Chicago Bears enjoying a trip to the Super Bowl XLI Championship game in 2006 against the Indianapolis Colts. Although the team came up short against the Colts in the Super Bowl, the Chicago Bears were the NFC Champions for that season. In 2006, Roberto was one of only 19 Hispanic players in the NFL among the 1,700 NFL players. Roberto retired from the NFL 2014 and enjoyed a very

successful broadcasting career with ESPN Deportes after retirement.

Jimmy Lawrence (Harlingen)

The first Harlingen
High football player to
make it to the NFL was
Jimmy Lawrence. Jimmy
excelled as a running
back for the Big Red
Machine and led the
Cardinals to three (3)
playoff appearances.

Jimmy's talent earned him an opportunity to play football at Texas Christian University (TCU). While at TCU, Jimmy made the All-Southwest Conference team three times and was a member of the TCU football team that won the 1935 National Title and is also a member of the TCU Sports Hall of Fame.

Jimmy was selected in the 1936 NFL draft. The Chicago Cardinals selected Jimmy in the 1st round as the 5th overall pick. Jimmy's talent allowed him to play four (4) NFL seasons for the Chicago Cardinals and Green Bay Packers in the late 1930s.

In 1939, the Chicago Cardinals traded Jimmy to the Green Bay Packers, and he was a member of the 1939 NFL Champion Green Bay Packers team. After retiring from football, Jimmy enjoyed a successful career as a leading football official in the RGV.

Sammy Garza (Harlingen)

The next Harlingen
High football player to
make it to the NFL was
Sammy Garza. Sammy
was a successful multisport athlete at Harlingen
High in the early 1980s.
Sammy is best known for
being a great Quarterback
(QB) as a passer who led
the Cardinals to a 30-10
record during his high
school career.

Sammy's exploits earned him a scholarship

to the University of Texas – El Paso (UTEP) where he was named the starting QB for the Miners as a freshman. Sammy completed his college career as one of the most prolific passers in UTEP history, ranking first in pass completions and completion percentage and ranking second in passing attempts, yards, and in touchdown passes.

In 1987, Sammy was selected by the Seattle Seahawks in the 8th round (216th overall) in the NFL draft as an offseason/practice squad player. Sammy was waived by the Seattle Seahawks in September 1987 but, due to the NFL Players Association strike, the NFL chose to continue the season with replacement players. Sammy was signed as QB by the St. Louis Cardinals replacement team. Sammy started one (1) NFL game as a QB for the St. Louis Cardinals during the 1987 season and remained on the roster as a backup QB.

Sammy was waived by the St. Louis Cardinals the following season, but he continued his professional football career in the Canadian Football League (CFL). Sammy's CFL career entailed time with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers from 1989-1991 and 1992-1995. Sammy was drafted and played for the Frankfurt Galaxy of the World League of American Football in 1991. He closed out his professional football career as a member of the Ottawa Rough Riders of the CFL in 1995. In 1993, Sammy led the Winnipeg Blue Bombers to victory in the Eastern Finals over the Hamilton Tiger-Cats, earning Sammy and his team an opportunity to play in the Grey Cup (the CFL's equivalent of a Super Bowl and Canada's largest annual sports and television event). In the 1993 Grey Cup game, Sammy scored a rushing touchdown against Edmonton Eskimos who won the game 33-23.

Sammy then began a successful career as a football coach starting with UTEP from 1996-1997 and 2000-2023 and with the Saskatchewan Roughriders from 1998-1999 and in 2004. Sammy has served as a wide receiver, running backs, and QB coach.

In 2005, Sammy was hired as a professional scout by the Dallas Cowboys in their College Scouting Department. Sammy served as the southwest area scout from 2008-2009 and the west coast scout from 2010-2011 and back to

southwest area scout in 2012. Sammy continues his passion for football and is still involved in the sport. He continues to work for the Dallas Cowboys and is involved in all scouting aspects for the five (5)-time World Champions.

Johnnie Jackson (Harlingen)

Our next Harlingen High player to make it to the NFL is Johnnie Jackson. Johnnie was a phenomenal Cardinal athlete from 1981-1985 and played QB for the football team. Johnnie accepted an offer to play football for the University of Houston Cougars football team and was named two (2)-time First Team All Southwest Conference in 1987 and 1988. In 1989, Johnnie was drafted in the 5th round as the 122nd overall pick by the San Francisco

49ers. Johnnie excelled as safety for the 49ers and was a member of the San Francisco 49ers team that won the Super Bowl in 1990 against the Denver Broncos. Johnnie played with and against many NFL Hall of Fame players. Johnnie played four (4) NFL seasons with the 49ers and the Green Bay Packers.

Leo Araguz (Harlingen)

Our latest Harlingen High football player to make it to the NFL is Leo Araguz. Leo started as kicker and punter for the Cardinals for four (4) years.

Leo accepted a football scholarship to Stephen F. Austin (SFA) University, where he was a four (4)-year starter. During his Junior year at SFA, Leo led the conference with average yards per punt (42.6). Leo was a 2x Second Team All Southland Conference punter in 1990 and 1991.

Leo began his professional football career in 1993. Leo had a two (2)-day tryout with the Dallas Cowboys but wasn't signed. In 1994, Leo was a free agent with the Miami Dolphins. In 1995, Leo was signed by the San Diego Chargers.

In 1996, Leo was drafted by the Rhein Fire of the World League of American Football in Germany. Leo was ranked as the 2nd best punter in the league with a 42.3 punt average and contributed by making eight (8) of 15 field goals that season.

In 1996, Leo tried out for the Oakland Raiders team as a punter. After some injuries to other punters, Leo was afforded the opportunity to punt for the last three (3) games of the Raiders' season. Leo's first NFL punt went for 52 yards against the Kansas City Chiefs. Leo's 41 yard-per-punt average over the final three (3) games

of the Raiders' season prompted the Raiders to sign Leo as their starting punter. In 1997, Leo finished as the 5th best NFL punter with a 45yard average and ranked 2nd in Raiders' football history behind former Oakland Raider and Pro Football Hall of Fame punter, Ray Guy. In 1998, Leo set the NFL record with 16 punts in one (1) game. Leo spent four (4) seasons with the Oakland Raiders.

In 2001, Leo punted for the New York/New Jersey Hitmen of the XFL and produced 44 punts for 1,788 yards (40.6-yard average). In 2001, Leo was signed by the St. Louis Rams but was released. He also signed with the Detroit Lions to replace their injured punter. Leo had a 41.9 yard-per-punt average for the Lions in just three (3) games.

In 2003, Leo signed with the Kansas City Chiefs but was released

before the season started. However, he was signed by the Minnesota Vikings that season and averaged 38.7 yards-per-punt in only 2 games.

In 2005, Leo was signed by the Seattle Seahawks and won the starting punter position. However, after a promising start, he was released mid-season. Leo's last NFL team was with the Baltimore Ravens in 2006, but he was released before the season began.

From 2011-2015, Leo punted for the Rio Grande Valley Sol of the X-League Indoor Football.

Leo retired from professional football after 22 years and returned to his hometown. He runs a construction company.

We are fortunate to have seven (7) individuals from our community who have reached the pinnacle of NFL football. I admire these athletes and their achievements in professional football as well as in life.

We have a first-round NFL draft pick in the first ever player draft in NFL history. We have two College Football champions. We have one NFL Champion and three Super Bowl Champions and one who played in a Super Bowl game. We have players from the Harlingen area who have played with and against NFL legends who are in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. We have players who have played in other countries, and all these players have significant professional football accomplishments. However, the one thing that all these talented players have in common is that they all had the opportunity to live and experience the NFL Dream. In case you are wondering, only 1.5% of American football players make it to the NFL. It truly is an elite club.
