Birders Flock to Harlingen Each November

The 30th Annual Rio Grande Valley Birding Festival (RGVBF) is a fiveday festival that celebrates birding in Harlingen. The Harlingen Convention Center hosts the RGVBF, a non-profit festival, which begins on November 8, 2023, and runs through November 12, 2023.

The RGVBF is run by more than 100 volunteers, highlights more than 60 vendors, and brings in approximately \$3 million to the local economy annually. "I think a lot of people

who live here don't even realize that we have the second largest bird festival in the entire country right here in Harlingen. The Rio Grande Valley (RGV) is one of the top birding destinations in all of North America. Our festival is an avenue for hundreds of birders from out of state, as well as locals from the RGV, to enjoy and learn about the birds here. We're always expanding things for our RGV locals to take advantage of, including trips to new places that birders aren't always allowed, a new fancy

Legends of Conservation Gala, and loads of family fun, from our art shows and contests to the live 'birds of prey' shows where you can interact with some amazing birds from just feet away," stated Justin LeClaire, Field Trip Chair of the RGVBF.

More than 500 participants from all over the world flock to Harlingen to attend the RGVBF for a chance to see millions of migratory and resident birds. RGVBF activities include the Birder's Bazaar tradeshow, keynote speakers, workshops, and more than 100 field trips by bus, van, or boat.

Saturday, November 11, 2023 or Sunday, November 12, 2023. Attendees must be registered to sign up for field trips, workshops, keynote speakers, or seminars, which are priced separately. Visitors who want to attend the tradeshow or free family/ children's activities such as the Birds of Prey Flight Show or Children's Nature Nook, do not need to register.

The festival team is a nonprofit group, with nearly all its supporters being volunteers. More help is always needed to keep the 2nd biggest bird festival in the United States running well. RGVBF has a variety of potential ways to help in either the planning or execution phases of the festival,

including tech work, children's art, hospitality/ housekeeping, and many others. Volunteers are given free access to many festival events! For questions about how you can help or sign up to be a volunteer, please email Sylvia at volunteers@ rgvbf.org.

The RGVBF starts on Wednesday, November 8, 2023, and ends on Sunday, November 12, 2023. Most of the events (aside from the field trips) occur at the Harlingen Convention Center located at 701 Harlingen Heights Drive in Harlingen. Concluding a Chapter of Valor and Loss with Honors for Harlingen's Fallen Hero

This past November, the Defense Personnel POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) announced that Army Air Corps 2nd Lt. Porter M. Pile, 24, of Harlingen, killed during World War II, finally had been accounted for. Pile, previously categorized

as MIA, was laid to rest on American soil with full military honors, including a flyover by his old squadron, at Arlington National Cemetery on October 31, 2023, 79 years after he paid the ultimate sacrifice.

Pile served with the 700th Bombardment Squadron (now the 700th

Airlift Squadron, Dobbins ARB, Georgia), 445th Bombardment Group. He was navigator on a B-24H Liberator bomber on his 23rd mission over Germany on September 27, 1944, when his aircraft was shot down in what would become, to this day, the largest single-day loss of aircraft by American combat forces. For his family and friends, the loss of Pile was made worse since his body was not recovered, and the Germans never reported him as a prisoner of war. Human remains found at the crash site in later years remained unidentified until scientists from DPAA used anthropological information, DNA analysis, and dental records to make a positive identification in late 2022. DPAA immediately identified the family by contacting Pile's oldest living relative, Randy Fleuriet of Harlingen.

Following the interment of Pile at Arlington National Cemetery on October 31, the Harlingen community will honor Pile with a concluding ceremony on November 9, 2023, at 11 a.m. at the Greater Chamber of Harlingen. Chamber President Javier De Leon will make introductory remarks with Mr. Fleuriet as the featured speaker. Both the Harlingen Police Department and Harlingen Fire Department will form the Honor Guard, with the Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) units from both Harlingen high schools also in attendance. The event will conclude with Assistant Choir Director of Harlingen High School, Alfonso Gonzalez, singing "You Raise Me Up," followed by the sounding of "Taps" by Marine Military Academy (MMA) cadets as a final tribute to Pile.

Harlingen residents are encouraged to show support for their hometown airman, missing in action for 79 years, either by attending the concluding ceremony on November 9 at 11 a.m. at the Greater Chamber of Harlingen, 311 E. Tyler, in Harlingen, or by taking a moment to reflect on the valor and courage of Pile and his entire generation of military heroes. •

Texas State Elections: What You Need to Know

On Election Day, November 7, 2023, Texans who have registered to vote by October 10, 2023, will have the opportunity to vote on 14 propositions to amend the Texas Constitution.

Early voting began on October 23, 2023 and ends on November 3, 2023. Early voting polling locations in Harlingen include the Harlingen County Annex Building, 3302 Wilson Road and the Harlingen Cultural Arts Center, 576 "76" Drive. For a full list of early voting polling locations in Cameron County, visit the Cameron County Elections & Voter Registration website, www.cameroncountytx. gov/elections/index.php/ locations.

Polls will be open on Election Day, November 7, 2023, from 7 am to 7 pm. Election Day polling locations are specific to your address. The same Cameron County Elections & Voter Registration website listed above will have a complete list of Election Day polling locations.

Be sure to bring a form of acceptable identification with you to vote, such as:

- Texas Driver License issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS)
- Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS
- Texas Personal Identification Card issued by DPS
- Texas Handgun License issued by DPS
- United States Military Identification Card containing the person's photograph
- United States Citizenship Certificate containing the person's photograph
- United States Passport (book or card)



GET READY TO VOTE IN THE UPCOMING ELECTION



Read all the proposed Texas Constitutional Amendments before casting your vote. They are listed in this article.



Research all the candidates and their platforms before casting your vote. Don't just rely on what you hear in the news or on social media.



Don't forget to bring your ID and proof of address with you to the polling station. You won't be able to vote without them!



Don't be afraid to ask for assistance if you need it. Poll workers are available to help you and ensure that everyone can vote.



Remember that every vote counts! Your voice matters and can make a difference in the outcome of the election.

ELECTION DAY IS NOVEMBER 7, 2023

Mail-in ballots by mail must be received by November 7, 2023. Here's a summary of each proposition:

Just Fresh is a familyowned restaurant in Harlingen that serves both healthy and delicious homemade dishes. Founded in 2018, they were known as GoodEats RGV and FueledbyFaith RGV before they changed their name to Just Fresh. They relocated from La Feria to Harlingen in January 2020.

Janie Leija-Perez, with her roots in a migrant family, harbors a deep enthusiasm for utilizing ingredients that are fresh. She runs the restaurant along with her husband Art and sisters/daughters. Their meals are homemade and Perez says, "Just Fresh is all about bringing wholesome and fresh, flavorful food to the community."

Some people think eating healthy means they are stuck with salads, but Just Fresh offers much more. They are best known for their chicken salad. They offer four types of chicken salad: grape almond (my personal favorite), cranberry pecan, chipotle, and traditional (mayo and mustard).

Just Fresh is also well known for their weekly low-calorie and portioned meal preps. Meal prep menus are usually released on Sundays for preorder and available for pickup on available for an additional fee. I have also eaten many of their weekly prep meals, with some of my favorites being the Cajun shrimp boil, turkey lasagna, and turkey zucchini boats.

Beyond chicken salad and meal preps, Just Fresh offers a revolving menu with such customer favorites as turkey plates, pancit, birria tacos, pasta salad, homemade daily soups, juices, and more. Charcuterie trays are available upon special request.

Just Fresh welcomes catering orders for local businesses and schools. Recent catering orders

Hours of operation for Just Fresh are Mondays,

11 am to 6:30 pm, and Tuesdays through Fridays, 10 am to 3 pm. They are closed on some Saturdays for caterings, Sundays for church/family time, holidays, and three weeks out of the year to vacation with their children.



Decades of Celebration

Cities in the Rio Grande Valley (RGV) will blast empty bullets and wave the United States and Texas flags in continuing over seven decades of honoring veterans.

"It's the right thing to do," George Rice, Veterans Land Board On-Site representative for the Rio Grande Valley State Veterans Cemetery in Mission, said over the phone. "If you look at the warrior cultures, honoring veterans who served in wars has been a key part of those empires and militarybased societies."

According to Rice, approximately 58,000 veterans call the Valley home and the RGV State Veterans Cemetery is the resting place for approximately 3,400 veterans.

From city parades to ceremonies featuring a color guard, RGV cities collaborate with local veteran-supporting organizations to ensure legacies.

One of these organizations is the Veterans' Memorial Project Committee at Pendleton Park in Harlingen.

The committee worked for several years to create their memorial for its 2012 dedication ceremony in honor of Darrell Shipp, a Harlingen local, who died bravely in Iraq in 2007. Since then, the committee has hosted three annual events to reflect its mission for veterans.

The committee will host its annual Veterans Day program at 11 a.m. on November 11 in collaboration with the Harlingen Police Department, Boy Scouts Troop 1701, and invited local veterans.

"I am proud to have something to do that we started up and get it ready for people to enjoy," Lenore Combs, the secretary for the Veterans' Memorial Project Committee, said over the phone. "The other side of me is disappointed when we don't get many people out [in attendance]. We used to have 200 seats: now, we're lucky if we fill 100."

The committee will also host its upcoming Wreaths Across America Day at 11 a.m. on December 16 and a sunset Memorial Day program in May.



Sunny Glen: Changing the Trajectory of a Child's Life

For nearly 88 years, Sunny Glen Children's Home (Sunny Glen) has been a refuge for abused, neglected, and forgotten children. Sunny Glen provides loving homes and several professional services to meet the needs of children and families in our community, with the support of churches and community partners. These children often face severe emotional or behavioral issues due to their circumstances. Sunny Glen's job is to love them and provide

for their physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual needs.

Over the span of their existence, Sunny Glen has helped more than 18,000 children in south Texas. Sunny Glen Executive Director/Chief Executive Officer Chase Palmer stated, "But with our expansion and the shelters we operate now, those numbers are just going to continue to escalate exponentially so it's great that we're able to have that kind of impact. To go from where we were serving 50 to 100 children a year to now, we are up to

potentially 5,000 to 6,000 a year."

For young adults who have aged out of the foster care system, Sunny Glen can provide them with the life skills needed in the real world. They provide access to community resources, cooking classes, seminars on finances, and even free housing with the Supervised Independent Living (SIL) Center. The SIL is in a two-story historic building in downtown Harlingen. Vintage on Jackson, Sunny Glen's thrift store, which helps fund its mission, is on the first floor, while the second-floor apartment houses up to 10 young adults.

Mr. Palmer said, "Our goal is to change the trajectory of a child's life. From being abused, neglected, without hope, to

understanding their value. We want them to know they are loved by us, but most importantly, that they are loved by God."

Dr. Rosalinda Mercado, Chief Operations Officer for Sunny Glen, spoke from her personal experience as a previous foster child in the Sunny Glen family. "I think a lot of times, the stigma of being fostered would often play a role in kids' lives as if it was something to bear or carry in a negative way. And what we have done at Sunny Glen is to let them be proud of their home. It is a place that they can call home because they are so well taken care of. They have now experienced true care and compassion that they hadn't experienced before. Without even knowing it, they are growing academically, emotionally, and spiritually because of the foundation that has been set for them. Providing them that place of hope has given them the change that they don't even realize is to a different trajectory."

Sunny Glen welcomes volunteers and community participation in their events, such as the annual



Harlingen High: On The Gridiron (Football)

As we near the end of the 2023 Texas High School Football Season, both Harlingen Programs look to finish strong. The Harlingen Cardinals look to punch their ticket to the 6A Region 4 Playoffs. While it has not been the smoothest of years, Manny Gomez's Cardinals have fought week in and week out. Here is what has transpired for the Cardinals.

After a 4-1 finish to Non-District Play, Harlingen was gearing up for a very competitive round of District Football in 32-6A. After opening up District with a loss to unbeaten Weslaco, the Cardinals bounced back with a 27-10 victory over Brownsville Hanna. Harlingen would then fall to unbeaten rival San Benito as the Greyhounds would win their first Battle of the Arroyo in four years. With the loss, Harlingen has lost three of their last four games.

With two more games left on the 32-6A Schedule, the Cardinals currently hold a 1-2

District record and a 5-3 overall record. Sitting in fourth place, Harlingen looks to finish strong by winning out their last two games, as well as clinch a Playoff Berth.

Harlingen South: On the Gridiron (Football)

Across town, Harlingen South has been dominant so far in District 16-5A DI. In their second season in 5A Classification, as well as their third season under Head Coach Israel Gonzalez, the Hawks have found their groove and continue to fly high. However, Harlingen South hasn't had it all that easy.

In what was a nearly identical start to the 2022 season, the Hawks began 2023 by going 2-2 in Non-District Play. But once District Play began, the Hawks have truly been the team to look out for. On a 4-0 Start to District, Harlingen South has outscored their opponents 205-23, scoring an average of 51 points per game.

With two more games on the Horizon, Harlingen South looks to bring home a third straight District Title under Israel Gonzalez. The Hawks previously brought home the 32-6A District Title in 2021, then shared a piece of the 16-5A DI title as part of a three-way tie with Brownsville Veterans and Weslaco East in 2022.

Harlingen High: On the Court (Volleyball)

With October all wrapped up, that can only mean one thing: Volleyball Playoffs. The 2023 UIL State Volleyball Playoffs are officially here, and it could not have come at a better time as both schools are in the final chapters of a long Volleyball Season.

The Harlingen Lady Cardinals, who have been the queens of the 32-6A hardwood, had a completely different season in 2023. After capturing District for the last two seasons under Joslynn Torres, the Lady Cardinals had a lot of expectations coming into 2023. After losing multiple key members due to graduation, the Lady Cardinals entered a rebuilding period. Despite battling hard every game night, Harlingen finished District with a 2-8 record. missing the postseason for the first time since 2018.

Harlingen South: On the Court (Volleyball)

Meanwhile, in 5A competition, the Harlingen South Lady Hawks certainly had quite the turnaround in 2023. From struggling to thriving, Harlingen South "flipped the script" and found the rhythm in the 2023 Texas High School Volleyball Season.

Last season, in their first year in 5A under first-year Head Coach Doryann Perez, Harlingen South would go 9-9 in District and miss the playoffs. Fast forward a year later, the Lady Hawks are on a tear in District 32-5A, holding a 15-3 District record and currently sit in second.

In what is arguably one the most competitive District, the Lady Hawks find themselves as the two seed of District 32-5A, behind District Champion Brownsville Pace, and ahead of third seed Brownsville Veterans.

Without a doubt one of the most impressive turnarounds in RGV Volleyball History, the Hawks look to keep the momentum going as they make their return to the playoffs for the first time since 2021. •
