Cemetery Continues Tradition to Honor Veterans

vergreen wreaths of **⊿** balsam fir adorned with a red. hand-tied bow are gently placed on veteran graves at Ashland Memorial Park Cemetery in Harlingen on the

second Saturday in December every year. The purpose? To honor and remember their service.

Last year more than 3 million wreaths were placed on veteran graves across the United States. The initiative, which informally started



the organization was established then. It is to remember, honor, and teach. Diana Campbell, cemetery manager and

location coordinator at Ashland Memorial Park Cemetery, says Ashland started participating eight years ago.


"We didn't know until a lady with a veteran's group here in Harlingen brought it up," Campbell said.

Ever since then, the cemetery has joined the 4,900 others doing the same in partaking in this annual tradition.

This year, the event will take place on Saturday, December 13 at 10 am. The guest speaker will be the Honorable Judge David Sanchez of the

444th District Court of Cameron County. This day also happens to be "Wreaths Across America Day," which was unanimously voted as such by the United States Congress in 2008.


For Campbell, it is especially meaningful since both her father

and husband are veterans.

"I am a daughter of a veteran and a wife of a veteran," she said. "It means a lot to me because my dad passed away three years ago, so three years ago was the first time I... was honored to know that my dad served our country and that the whole nation recognized him on that day. Even though they didn't know his name, he was a veteran and he takes part of the honoring that day."

There are 222 veterans buried at Ashland. Campbell mentions that they are always looking for sponsors for the \$17 wreaths that are delivered from Maine every year.

involve volunteers since volunteer drivers make the crosscountry journey to various cemeteries and locations around the nation, dropping off millions of wreaths.

"It's a big undertaking," Campbell said.

She hopes the community knows that they too can get involved in this yearly event.

"They can attend the event," she said. "They can come out here and help us lay wreaths on the graves... if they can't donate for a wreath, they can donate their time and just come be with us."

Campbell mentions that there are graves that don't get visited anymore due to aging relatives or perhaps because their family is long since gone.

"There are veterans that don't have families that come visit them... there's no flowers, nobody's come to see them in a while, and even if just once a year, that veteran can have something, it's all worth it," Campbell said.



Year In Review

2025: Some Signs of Growth Despite Long-Standing Business Closures

reflecting on 2025, the biggest news of the year for Harlingen had to be the early morning fire on July 22 that destroyed Johnny's True Value hardware store at 914 W. Tyler Ave. After an investigation, the Harlingen Fire Marshal's Office ruled the cause of the fire as "undetermined." The building was then demolished with an empty lot now standing in its place. Losing a longstanding business such as Johnny's, which had been in business for 40+ years, was a significant loss for Harlingen. The community came together, holding multiple events to raise funds for the store's displaced employees.

Many other longstanding businesses struggled and closed, such as:

La Feria News, which closed after 102 years in publication

The Light House Lighting Center, which

is liquidating items and closing all its Rio Grande Valley locations after 53 years in business

Dick Office Supply, which closed after 45 years in business at the end of 2024

F.Y.E. after 20+ years in business

Los Fresnos News, after 20 years in business

Brain Freeze, which closed after 14 years in business

Despite a challenging economy, some new businesses opened in Harlingen in 2025. Most were restaurants, but a few retailers opened as well.

One of the most anticipated business openings of 2025 was the Harlingen Urgent Vet that opened on August 12 at 6710 W. Expressway 83. It is the first urgent veterinary clinic in Harlingen. Services

include allergic reactions, vomiting, routine and emergency surgeries, dental cleanings, vaccines, wellness visits, and more.

Sunshine Strip #36; Furniture Express at 1802 S. 77 Sunshine Strip, Suite 200; Cavender's, a national western clothing store, at 914 Dixieland Road; Casa Kevin, a discount store, at 710 N. 77 Sunshine Strip; Dollar

General (DG) Market at 1379 Bass Blvd.; and Western Outpost at 221 E. Monroe.

The Other Room Wine Bar opened on October 30 at 119 W. Van Buren, Suite 7.

Cookies4College has indicated they will open their first storefront at 119 W. Van Buren, Suite 6, by the end of December 2025.

Looking into 2026 and beyond, Harlingenites can look forward to the following business openings:

HOTWORX, a 24-hour sauna workout facility, will be opening in 2026 (if unable to open in winter 2025).

Additional tenants are coming to the Dilworth Shopping Center such as a combination Jamba Juice/Auntie Anne's Pretzels, Cold Stone Creamery, and Little Caesars Pizza.

Mexican food restaurants Taquero Mucho and Limon Mexican Grill & Seafood will open sometime in 2026.

Texas Brewery Patrol, a locally owned brewery with restaurant, is in the works to open in 2026.

HTeaO, a chain of tea shops from Texas, will open its first Harlingen store next fall. It will be located at 1219 W. Tyler, with the owner's other business, Rio Valley Meat and Butcher Shop.



Atomic Kids Learning Center, a daycare facility from Brownsville, will open its first Harlingen location in 2026.

The Deep End, a golf simulation bar, will be adding pickleball courts to their location at 3601 W. Business 83.

ust along the city limits of Harlingen, heading south on the expressway, sits the Longhorn Cattle Company at 355 W. Expressway 83. Built back in 1985 on what was once nothing but country land, the iconic barn with the longhorn logo, and the passing scent of smoked BBQ cannot be missed.

Although it's technically in our neighboring city of San Benito, Longhorn Cattle Company is a go-to for so many in the Rio Grande Valley, especially Harlingen residents. Its location makes it easy for anyone to stop in and enjoy an



amazing home-cooked meal in a family-style setting. As they would say, "Step out of the city, and into the country!" And if you are lucky, you just might get to step out back and meet the Longhorn steers Wayland and Willie.

I stopped by to congratulate the owner, Bill Turner, on their 40year anniversary, and we chatted a little about how it all started and what keeps them going.

Founded by Bill's father-in-law, Longhorn Cattle Company has always been a family-oriented BBQ restaurant. However, when Bill and his wife Lisa took over, they knew they wanted to up the ante.

To stand out from the competition they knew the quality of meat would be the ticket

to longevity, so that became their number one focus. The menu says it all, one page and five meat options: melt-in-your-mouth brisket, Polish sausage, lean tender smoked turkey breast, baby back ribs, and fall-off-the-bone smoked chicken. Each of them perfectly seasoned, BBQed to perfection, and served in variation.

But wait a minute, what about the world-

famous bean soup everyone talks about? Bill assured me that was all part of the master plan. You see, part of their success is that they don't waste anything, and the beans are a perfect example.

Renderings and secret seasonings contribute to their delicious flavor. So, if the beans and bananas pudding get you in the door, it's the main course that keeps you coming back.

While we visited, I decided to try something on the menu I had never had before: Loco Bill's signature sandwich, the Poor Boy. It's a Hoagie style sandwich stuffed with chopped brisket, sliced brisket, and Polish sausage. All I can say is that it did NOT disappoint. My usual go to order is the chop cheddar spud that was featured on the Texas Bucket List, which is actually the "newest" item on the menu, introduced in the 1990s. To be honest, I'm not sure which one I like more now, but either way, you can't go wrong! I did grab that banana pudding to go, and do not sleep on the flan by local baker, Marcella.

It was such a pleasure having lunch with Bill and just hearing about the restaurant. The atmosphere in the barn is calm and relaxing. There are no TVs, and lots of natural light. Bill and Lisa were intentional about creating a space that was inviting and family friendly. 40 years is a long time to stay in business, so before I left, I had to ask what he considered the key to this milestone.

His advice is the (Keep it Simple) KIS

method. He's had a dedicated staff that has been with him for decades. Bill's sage advice includes "Don't lose your identity; a small menu says a lot" and "Don't lose focus on what you're doing, and don't overthink; just keep things as simple as you can."

You may be wondering about the title of this article. Bill said, "I do want to tell you one more thing: I shot the bull." The motto that he and Lisa, who passed away in 2020, had means "If you get an opportunity to visit with somebody, take it, because you never know who you are talking to, and you never know what's

going to come out of it." I shot the bull.

• 1 large green bell pepper

Christmas Morning Casserole

- 8 large eggs
- breakfast sausage
- · handful of spinach
- 1 cup shredded sharp cheddar cheese
- 1 cup diced mushrooms
- 1 large diced onion
- teaspoon salt
- teaspoon pepper

Instructions:

- 1. Using a large skillet over medium to high heat, brown the sausage. After the sausage is cooked, pour it into a bowl and set it aside.
- 2. In the same skillet, toss in your onion, spinach, bell pepper, and mushrooms. Cook while stirring for about 7 minutes.
- 3. Once they're cooked,

- get a large bowl and beat the eggs. Add all the eggs and whisk them together. Add the cheese to the eggs, combining them all together.
- 4. Get a large baking dish and spray it with coconut cooking spray. (This will make it easy to cut and serve.)
- 5. Add the sausage and all the cooked ingredients into the baking dish.

- 6. Cover the dish in foil paper and place to set in the fridge overnight.
- 7. On Christmas morning bake the dish at 375 degrees for 12 minutes and enjoy!

Not only will your home be filled with the joy of Christmas but also the delicious smell of this casserole. This dish has been a favorite for my family since I was a young girl. I hope it becomes a favorite for your family as well.




Moves, Adds, and Changes



Transformations: Nonprofits Faith, Freedom, and a

Fresh Start

nzo Racca and his wife **C**handré's move from Boston to the Rio Grande Valley (the "Valley") wasn't the result of a long-term plan, but rather a leap of faith during a challenging season in their young family's life. Seeking support and community, they relocated so his wife could be near friends and mentors involved in ministry work at the Faith Pleases God Church. It was during this time of personal healing and reflection that they began envisioning bringing Transformations—a faith-supported, evidencebased community dedicated to helping people overcome addiction—to the United States.

Enzo had experienced the power of recovery firsthand and felt called to help others. "About 15 years ago, I was in state prison in Massachusetts, facing five to ten years for bank robbery to support

my lifestyle of addiction," he said. "I was in and out of prison for over 20 years, going through the programs and the shortterm healings."

His turning point came when his mother confronted him after seeing him on the news. "She told me I broke her heart into four pieces, and I was so crushed on

the inside that I did it again," he said. "I went back to my prison cell, and I was contemplating suicide when I looked out my prison window and God showed me a vision. I was holding a Bible." That moment changed everything.

After completing a therapeutic program himself, he devoted his life to helping others do the same. After graduating from his program, Enzo went on to be a full-time student at college, receiving a Bachelor of Arts in pastoral ministries and biblical studies.

Today, that personal redemption fuels his mission, which led to Transformations USA—a new branch of the faith-based recovery community that began in Australia and is now taking root in South Texas.

At the heart of Transformations is a unique blend of evidence-based recovery and spiritual renewal. Still, Enzo emphasizes that Transformations welcomes those who may be uncertain about faith. "It's okay if they're not 100% sure before they come in, but if they're willing and open to seeing if it will click with them and connect with them, then we would encourage them to come in," he explained.

At Transformations, community and

accountability are at the heart of lasting change. Participants are encouraged to be open about their struggles, not just with program leaders but with peers who share similar journeys. This peer-to-peer approach allows individuals to be gently confronted with areas they need to work on while also receiving support and guidance on how to overcome them. By combining honest feedback with practical encouragement, the program fosters both personal growth and hope for real, lasting transformation.

Transformations
depends entirely on

donors. This support allows Transformations to focus fully on its mission: helping people overcome addiction and rebuild their lives. The community's involvement is what makes lasting change possible—restoring families, breaking cycles of addiction, and creating hope for future generations.

Looking ahead, Transformations plans to expand far beyond the Valley. "The vision for Transformations Program USA is to plant a men's home, a women's home, and women with children [facility] here in the Valley and throughout the state of Texas," Enzo shared. "But we also want to have centers in every state... anywhere where the need is necessary." That growth, he believes, begins with faith and the community's continued support.

And for those ready to take their first step toward

freedom, Enzo's message is simple: "Just don't give up. Keep showing up."

Artist of the Month

or country artist
Brody Rivers,
music wasn't a
lifelong plan — it was
something that found
him when the world
stood still.

When Rivers was in college at the University of Texas San Antonio (UTSA), he began serving in a local worship band. "When I finished college and came back home, COVID hit. That's when I really got into music. I started learning guitar."

What began as a creative outlet during quarantine soon turned into a passion, leading to the birth of the Brody Rivers Band in 2023, and a fast-rising music career rooted in

small-town authenticity. Alongside Rivers, the band features David Rodriguez on bass, Steven "Steph" Flores on electric guitar, Jose Guerrero on drums, and Javier Alcala, a multi-instrumentalist who fills in on drums, electric, or bass whenever needed.

Born and raised in Rio Hondo, Texas, Rivers' sound is rooted in the soul of rural South Texas. "Growing up in a small country town, everyone listened to country music," he says. "That's just the way of life down here." His blend of mellow Texas country, nostalgic '90s influences, and a modern candy-coating gives his music a familiar yet refreshing flavor — a sound he describes as "soft Texas country with a little grit."

While artists like Cody Johnson, Randall King, and Tyler Childers have helped shape his sound, Rivers' voice and storytelling rise from a place all his own. "It's like a complete exaggeration," he laughs, explaining how he takes real-life moments and gives them a little extra oomph to make them truly sing.

Rivers' dedication to storytelling has already earned him national recognition. Rivers launched into the mainstream music scene in 2024 with a bold step onto the national stage, auditioning for American Idol on ABC and breaking into the show's Top 100.

His 2025 single

was nominated for
Song of the Year at the
Josie Awards — hosted
at the Grand Ole Opry.
"Just having your name
just even announced
there is incredible," he
says.

Despite his success, Rivers is refreshingly down-to-earth. A selftaught musician and

the only performer in his family ("except my mom, when she tries to sing but messes up all the lyrics," he jokes), he's also juggling life outside of music. Between long weekends of performances, he's working on opening his own insurance agency and preparing for one of his biggest milestones yet fatherhood. "I've got a baby boy on the way," he says proudly. "That's my number one [priority]."


And when the lights go down and guitars are packed away, Rivers finds peace in simple things. He enjoys woodworking, building Pinterest-inspired home projects for his fiancée, and carving out time for family. "Life's good right now," he says. "I just want to see which of these paths is going to provide for me for now."

For young musicians in the Rio Grande Valley, Rivers lends one tiny piece of advice: consistency. "It's what every other artist has been telling me," he says. "It's the truth."

Whether it's music, family, or the next great song, one thing's for sure — Brody Rivers is composing his own path, one verse at a time.

The Valley's Tennis Paradise

Indian Wells: Tennis Paradise

professional tennis fans hear the term, "Tennis Paradise," they often think of the Indian Wells tennis center located in Palm Springs, California. It's home to the BNP Paribas Open, which hosts the most elite men's and women's professional tennis players on the ATP Masters 1000 and WTA 1000 tour. Top players like Carlos Alcaraz, Jannik Sinner, Aryna Sabalenka, and Coco Gauff convene at Indian Wells each March to compete in this highly lucrative and premier tennis tournament.

My brothers and I attended the BNP Paribas Open last year and we quickly understood why Indian Wells is called Tennis Paradise. The tennis matches are of high caliber, and spectators receive every conceivable amenity. Palm Springs, California is a desert oasis with beautiful landscapes, great weather, and no shortage of celebrities. We saw Bill Gates, Zendaya,

and Will Ferrell at the Carlos Alcaraz match. As a first-timer, it was truly a remarkable experience and one that I will cherish forever.

Harlingen's USTA Pro Circuit Event

I was also a firsttimer at the 2025 Men's \$30,000 ITF World Tennis tournament, held at the Harlingen Country Club (HCC), this October. It is a USTA Pro Circuit Event, which is the best way for tennis players to qualify for higher-level events. This professional men's tennis tournament has been held in our community for more than 20 years with the help of host HCC tennis pro/ director, Andy Carter.

The 2025 Men's ITF

who have gone on to succeed in professional tennis.

Harlingen Hospitality

One unique feature of the tournament is that the players stay with "host" families from our community. Host families open their homes and hearts to these young professionals and provide them with all the support (lodging, food, etc.) that they need while playing at HCC for the week. The new singles champion, Alex Martinez from Spain, mentioned during his post-victory speech how much he had appreciated his host family and everything that they did for him throughout the week. He said his stay felt like being "at home," allowing him to focus on his play and ultimately win the

tournament.

Affordable Admission for All

Admission to the weeklong tournament is free to watch all the qualifying and main draw singles and doubles matches. The only exception are the semifinal and final matches, which cost \$5 to attend with "first come first serve" seating in general admission. This seating is equivalent to courtside seats at any major tennis tournament but with a better view. You are literally on top of the action with seating only a few yards away from the court, which is a dream for tennis fans

and amateurs looking to improve their own skills.

VIP seats for tournament sponsors, HCC supporters, and their guests are also available. All sponsorship funds are used for player prize money, tournament costs

for officials, and charity. This year's chosen charity was the Sunny Glen Children's Home. The tournament organizers also provided food and drinks free of charge for all spectators/volunteers for most of the week. Tournament shirts were only \$10. Compared to Indian Wells, the prices are an absolute bargain.

RGV's Tennis Paradise

So, is this the Rio Grande Valley's (RGV's) Tennis Paradise? Yes, it sure is! First and foremost, it is the only professional USTA tennis tournament in the entire RGV.

Secondly, the HCC is a great venue. They have plenty of free parking with quick access to the immaculate tennis courts. The volunteers, staff, and members are courteous, friendly, and accommodating to all

spectators, especially children. For those who love tennis but don't want to spend a lot of money to watch quality professional tennis, this is the place to be.

The weather was amazing throughout the three days that I attended the tournament. It was in the mid-70s all week. This may have just been good timing but, nonetheless, HCC was prepared and provided covered seating to protect spectators from the sun.


Student Athlete Outreach

Tennis Paradise does exist in Harlingen, and it happens every year in October at the Harlingen Country Club. Join me in paradise in 2026!◆


