



Barbecue, Backpacks & Big Hearts: Reyna's Backto-School Tradition in its 8th Year

It was the summer of 2018, and Reyna's BBQ & Cocina had just opened its Weslaco location in May. Children were out for summer break with many heading to the beach. But in late June, an event that the National Weather Service called The Great June 2018 Flood of the Rio Grande Valley (RGV), impacted the area costing the RGV millions.

"The city of Weslaco got flooded pretty bad," Zeke Reyna, owner of

Reyna's BBQ & Cocina remembers. "A lot of neighborhoods, a lot of people were going to lose their homes."

One morning that week, after a significant amount of rain had devastated the area. Reyna realized people weren't going to be able to reach their restaurant due to flooding. He decided to give away the food they were preparing for the day.

"It was the right thing

to do. It's who and what we are about," Reyna said. "We gave away hundreds, thousands of sandwiches. It was a ton."

Reyna remembers the "beautiful response" not only from Weslaco but the whole RGV. This event led Reyna to start planning a back-to-school giveaway.

"We started raising some funds to do a back-to-school giveaway. That's how it started...

and it started growing and growing," he said.

Reyna's BBQ & Cocina, along with the Reyna Family Foundation, a nonprofit organization Zeke and his family founded, have hosted these events both in the Weslaco and Harlingen restaurant locations. This year will be their eighth year. They, along with other sponsors, give away backpacks filled with school supplies to students in the community. This year will mark the first time they add McAllen to the list at Reyna's BBQ &

Cocina's newest location. They have given out more than 500 backpacks per location in the past, and they aren't slowing down.

"The last two to four years have been incredibly meaningful because of the inflation that has unfortunately occurred in our economy," he said. "So to see the kids show up... it's been awesome."

Erika Reyna, Zeke's wife, says that the Reyna Family Foundation is incredibly blessed to host this event annually.

"As a mom, I know

how overwhelming the back-to-school season can be," she said. This event is our way of giving back, lifting up families, and making a positive impact on their back-to-school experience."

She mentioned that the past few years, the Weslaco Dreamettes have been instrumental in ensuring everything for the drive is ready. They help prepare and hand out backpacks.

For Erika, the giveaway is more than just backpacks and school supplies.

"It's about showing up for our community, supporting the children of our future, and letting every child know they

are seen, valued, and capable of great things. It's a tradition rooted in love, and we're honored to continue it year after year," she said.

The Reyna Family Foundation's 8th Annual Back to School Giveaway will be held Friday, August 1 at their McAllen location, and Saturday, August 2 at their Weslaco and Harlingen restaurants. In the summer, I find it most satisfying to create fresh and easy recipes like the Easy Taco Salad.

Ingredients:

- 1 pound of turkey ground beef
- Pinch of salt and pepper
- 1 teaspoon of garlic powder
- 1 diced onion
- 1 diced tomato
- 2 cut and smushed ripe avocados
- 1 small bag of shredded sharp

Easy Taco Salad

cheddar cheese

- Handful of your choice of green (I prefer fresh spinach)
- Juice from one lime (optional)

Instructions:

- 1. Let's start by adding the turkey ground beef to a large skillet at a medium to high heat. Add salt, pepper, and garlic powder. Let it cook for about 25 minutes. With ground turkey, you always want to make sure the meat is thoroughly cooked.
- 2. While the turkey is cooking, get a goodsized salad bowl and add your green to the bottom of it.
- 3. When the meat has finished cooking, add the warm meat on top of your greens followed by the shredded sharp cheddar so it melts on top.

- 4. Top it off with the onion, tomato, and smushed avocado.
- 5. I like to add juice from one whole lime to finish.

I hope you find this to be a delightfully easy yet filling recipe.


New Cafés and Restaurants

Unlocking Potential for M.I. Academy this

September

'Unlocking Potential' and 'Brewing up Success' are the themes that will mark this year's M.I. Academy's 4th Annual Gala. The event is set for Saturday, September 27, 2025, from 6 pm to 8:30 pm at the TSTC Cultural Arts Center. It is the first time the gala will be held at this location; previous galas have been held at Wild August Nursery and Flower Farm and at the

post office in downtown Harlingen.

Linda Noell, M.I. Academy founder and director, said preparation is underway and she is excited to host it there for the first time.

"It's a little bigger this year," she said. "This is the biggest space we've had to decorate."

M.I. Academy, a nonprofit organization "Where Individual Meets Opportunity," offers students with disabilities a place to continue their education

as well as life skills programs once they have aged out of the public school system. Their objectives include fine arts, excursions, job site training, community involvement, continuing education, and vocational training. Housed at the Church of Christ on Harrison in Harlingen, it was originally located at Noell's own home. The year was 2020 and Noell's daughter, who has Down Syndrome, had graduated from high school. After a few people told her she should start something in Harlingen to address the gap, Noell took the leap.

"With God's help and the support of the great community behind me, I started that path," Noell said.

With their third year having been completed

in May, they are currently gearing up for their fourth year. The gala helps fund the school year.

"This event is extremely important. It carries us through the year," Noell said. Something Noell eagerly shared was how involved the students are in the gala.

"Our students will be very involved with greeting people and serving. They will also perform," she said. She added that students will even be working behind the scenes by making some of the silent auction items. "They will be involved with every aspect of the fundraiser."

Putting together a fundraiser like the gala is work, but Noell gives credit to the sponsors for their contributions and the group of people that help organize and put on the event.

"I have 27 people on my fundraising team... parents are very involved. It's a good group of people," she said. "I'm beyond blessed – the Lord has blessed us and brought the people that need to be here. I'm just so inspired by the community support. I give all glory to God because He's the one that is doing it." Tickets for the event are on sale now. You can purchase a general admission entry or a couple price entry. Sponsorship opportunities are also available such as the Excelsior Bean Sponsor that includes a reserved table for 8 people with wine service, charcuterie at the table, and prominent logo placement on their website and at the event.

Harley's Hounds: Nonprofits Finding Homes and

Fostering Love

When Jessica "Jess" Cantu and her husband lost their beloved dog Harley after nearly 13 years together, they knew they needed to honor his memory. "He was with us through everything—dating, our wedding, moving across the country, then welcoming our daughters into the world," Jess says. "Every dog deserves an opportunity to be [loved] like Harley." From this conviction, Harley's Hounds, a nonprofit rescue dedicated to giving stray and surrendered dogs in the Rio Grande Valley (RGV) a chance at a loving home, was born.

The mission of Harley's Hounds is a grassroots effort to save and improve the lives of animals in three key ways: 1) community education about responsible pet ownership, 2) fundraising to provide resources for animals in need, and 3) creating stable pathways to adoption for rescued dogs. Their philosophy is simple but powerful: street dogs belong on couches.

"The animals in South Texas rarely have a voice," Jess says, "and until they do, you'll continue to hear mine."

Stray dogs make up the majority of Harley's Hounds' intakes. "I've only had to step foot in a shelter a couple of times," Jess shares. "That shows how many strays are out there, under-cared for." The team's goal is to catch these animals before they end up in overcrowded shelters, working with local partners to trap or safely capture feral dogs that have never experienced human kindness.

One rescue story that sticks with Jess is Hercules, a German Shepherd found in Santa Rosa, severely malnourished and ill. "He tested positive for everything you can

imagine," she recalls, "With the partnership through our vet, we got him clean." Hercules was adopted by a family in Pennsylvania, but when their dog didn't get along with him, Jess arranged for him to come back to South Texas. Hercules has now been a permanent part of Jess's family for three years, living the life every dog deserves. "Some people call it a foster failure, but I call it a foster success."

Though funding is always needed, Jess emphasizes that Harley's Hounds'

biggest need is foster homes. "When you take a dog into a rescue, you have to have a plan, or you get overwhelmed and they don't get the care that they deserve," she explains. "We

have to turn dogs away because we don't have enough hands and feet to help."

Many people fear associated costs when it comes to fostering animals, but the rescue covers all expenses for fosters, including veterinary care and supplies. Others avoid fostering because they fear getting attached, but Jess encourages them to focus on the joy of helping a dog find a loving home. "The joy far outweighs the heartbreak."

While acknowledging the emotional tax of being a foster, the growth Jess sees in these rehabilitated dogs makes the daunting task worthwhile. "You might save one life by fostering," Jess says, "but to that one life, you're their whole entire world."

The adoption process

begins with an online application where families can share their household dynamics and preferences. "Every dog comes with different personalities and needs," Jess explains, which is why fostering the pet prior to adoption is encouraged first, giving families a chance to get to know a dog in their own environment.

There are many ways to support Harley's Hounds beyond adopting or donating. Volunteers can help transport dogs, share posts to spread awareness, or assist with fundraising. Recently, Jess launched

a campaign to recruit ambassadors in all 50 states to help share Harley's Hounds' mission nationwide. "We're already in 15 states, which is really exciting," she says.

Jess's hope for Harley's Hounds is to secure consistent funding through local business sponsorships and expand their fostering network, allowing them to help even more animals in need. Another hope she holds dear is to help spread the awareness of heartworms, a very common disease for animals in the RGV. Prevention, she

mentions, is easy, but treatment is expensive and difficult.

Ultimately, Jess hopes to see continued progress in animal welfare throughout the RGV, especially for the stray dogs in need of a caring home. "Open your heart and home to an animal that needs you, and your life will be so much better."

Harlingen Cardinals Football Preview

We will start with the Harlingen Cardinal football team where, as you know, "Cardinal Spirit Never Dies" and "It Is What It Is." Coach Gomez continues to lead a Cardinal team that respects the tradition of excellence and winning. Coach Gomez is highly respected and has continued the Harlingen

Cardinal football legacy. He routinely develops hard-nosed football teams with players who are fulfilling their lifelong dreams of playing Cardinal football.

Coach Manny Gomez has 30 players returning from last year's squad, which finished the 2024 32-6A campaign with a 5-6 overall record and made it to a bi-district playoff game.

Offensive players to watch this season are running back (RB) Noah Huerta, quarterback (QB) Hassan Woolery, wide receiver (WR) Aiden Flores, WR Aiden Cervantes, WR Dayton Mireles, RB Luis Gonzalez, WR Bubba Medrano, QB Gavin Cisneros, RB Nathaniel Gonzales, and WR Maddox Hernandez.

The Cardinal offense has the potential to be an extremely explosive



offense based on two key returning starters. QB Hassan Woolery showed great talent in an injuryshortened 2024 season coupled with standout, three (3) year varsity starter, and prolific RB Noah Huerta. Huerta is hands down one of the best RBs in south Texas and will, most likely, take his talents to the collegiate level. Expectations are high for a great senior year, so take advantage of watching Noah compete in Harlingen before he leaves to compete at the next level.

Additionally, an exceptional WR Corp led by Hernandez and Flores will help bolster the Cardinals offensively in 2025, especially with Woolery being at full strength.

Defensive players to watch are linebacker (LB) Davian Renteria, LB/defensive line (DL) Saul Cerda, defensive back (DB) Dayton Mireles, LB Luis Gonzalez, DB Bubba Medrano, LB Nathaniel Gonzales, DB Arturo Torres, DB Noah Gutierrez, DL Jayden Martinez, and DL Jayden Secrest.

The Big Red Machine will be led by LB Renteria and LB/DL Cerda who have one job: to stop the other teams,

which will be no easy feat.

The 2025 Harlingen Cardinal Football season begins Friday, August 15 to Friday, November 7, with five (5) home games played at Boggus Stadium. The Cardinal football schedule is full of stiff competition starting with scrimmages against McAllen High (McHi) and Sharyland, followed by non-district foes Weslaco, Edinburg Vela, Laredo United South, Mission Veterans, and perennial powerhouse, Cuero High, before competing in their 32-6A District games. The Cuero game will be played at Boggus Stadium on Friday, October 3.

Five teams are competing in District 32-6A, but based on the strength of schedule, I am sure that Coach Gomez, his staff, and his players are poised and ready to showcase their team's ability this season and to make a solid run for the district crown and a deep playoff run.

Harlingen South Hawks Football Preview

On the Harlingen South Hawks side, Coach Gonzalez has created a great culture in the locker room and their program motto is "No Fear All Faith." Hawks players have been "all in" with this mantra since Coach Gonzalez's arrival.

Coach Gonzalez has 35 players returning from the 2024 team. Last season, the Hawks had an overall record of 6-5 and a district record of 5-3 competing in District 16-5A, making it a bi-district playoff game.

The Hawks have five (5) offensive starters and seven (7) defensive starters returning to lead their team.

Offensive players to watch this season are QB Austin Shroyer, WR Yariel Cabrera, WR Jaziel Ovalle, WR Gavin Ramirez, tight end (TE) Matthew Alvear, TE/QB Frank Puente, RB Gian Harvey, Offensive Line (OL) Ryan Luna, and OL Christian Chino. The offense will be led by QB Shroyer and will be an "all hands-on deck" approach among WRs Cabrera, Ovalle, Ramirez, and RB Harvey and TE Alvear to power them this season. Of course, the Hawks will have quality OL Luna and Chino battling in the trenches.

The Hawk defense is stout and is expected to be a major strength of their team assuming all players stay healthy so they can continue to build from last year.

Defensive players to watch are LB Marcus Garza, LB Olek Lerma, LB Jackson Fernandez, DL Cash Harrell, DL Anthony Lerma, DL Joe Carter Nunez, DB Julian De Leon, DB Jacob Garza, DB Yariel Cabrera, and DB Gian Harvey. This unit is talented and may be able to provide shut-down potential, adding a great tool for the Hawks game plan this season. Several players will play on both sides of the ball. helping the Hawks with keeping the tradition of making it to the playoffs every year since Coach Gonzalez's arrival at Harlingen South.

The Hawks Football season begins on Friday, August 14 until Friday, November 7, with five (5) home games played at Boggus Stadium. The Hawks start with scrimmages against Sharyland, Edinburg Vela, and Weslaco followed with non-district games versus Nikki Rowe and Harlingen, then proceeding to their eight (8) district contests. Notable district games include Flour Bluff and Corpus Christi Veterans, which will be played at home.

An Anticipated Season Ahead

Of course, the most notable game of the 2025 football season is "Bird Bowl." This year's rivalry game will be held on Friday, September 5. As always, school and team pride and city bragging rights are at stake.

I commend the players who have been training and working hard




