For 92 years, nonprofit organization Harlingen Concert Association (HCA) has been committed to recruiting exceptional artists to present high-quality shows. Thanks topo season ticketholders and sponsors, as well as a strong partnership with Live on Stage, based in Nashville, Tennessee, HCA concerts are offered at affordable, family-friendly prices.

Education and inspiration are at the heart of HCA's mission. They have proudly sponsored performances by these world-class artists at local schools. In addition to sharing their music, the artists often give performance advice and answer questions about their instruments to their student audiences. They engage with the students one-onone, giving hugs and high fives, signing autographs, and taking selfies with dozens of star-struck youngsters and their chaperones.

For some students, HCA outreach programs offer their only opportunity to experience a live performance by a world-class tenor, play saxophone alongside a Grammy-nominated artist, hear classical music played on the accordion, or shake hands with a musician from across the United States or world.

Carolina Kortan--UT Austin





### Recipes

### By Mamie Moon

Add this dessert dish to your Thanksgiving meal and it's sure to be a hit! Pairs well with a nice warm cup of coffee.

### **Ingredients:**

Cake:

- 2½ cups almond flour
- 1 tablespoon pumpkin pie spice
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 2 tsp baking soda
- ½ tsp salt
- ½ cup coconut oil
- 1½ cup monk fruit sweetener

## Keto Pumpkin Bundt

Cake


- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 3 large eggs
- 1 cup canned unsweet pumpkin puree

### Icing:

- 1 tablespoon butter softened
- 3½ cups lactose free cream cheese
- ½ cup powdered monk fruit
- 2 tablespoons sugar free almond milk
- ½ tsp vanilla extract

### **Instructions:**

- 1. Let's get started by preheating oven to 350 degrees. Spray your Bundt cake pan with cooking spray.
- 2. In a large bowl, whisk together with a stand mixer almond flour, salt, pumpkin pie spice, cinnamon spice, baking soda and powder, and



3. In a separate bowl, mix the coconut oil, vanilla extract, unsweet pumpkin puree, and eggs until smooth.

- 4. Now we can beat the almond flour mixture into the pumpkin mixture.
- 5. Spoon the batter into the greased Bundt cake pan.
- 6. Bake at 350 for 40-45 minutes.
- 7. Once it's done, take it out and allow it to cool down for 20 minutes.
- 8. Get a cake display dish to carefully insert the cooled down Bundt cake.
- 9. In a medium sized bowl, beat with a mixer the butter, cream cheese, vanilla extract, and the powdered monk fruit.

It's ready to slice, serve, and enjoy! Happy Thanksgiving!



When it comes to Mexican restaurants in Texas the list is LONG, and the closer you get to the border the more prominent they become. From taco trucks to 5-star Mexican cuisine dining experiences, you name it, we got it.

But tucked away in each city is that one special place that locals look to for special occasions. The place they grew up celebrating birthdays, graduations, and so much more. It's the place their parents took them, and in turn they took their own kids. The restaurant where so many memories are made and the nostalgia

runs deep.

For Harlingen, Pepe's Mexican Restaurant is that special place for so many families, mine included. I was honored to be able to sit down and visit with the owner, Mr. Joe Ayala, and talk about his journey.

If you were raised in Harlingen, the chances that you have never been to Pepe's are slim to none. BUT in the event that you haven't made your way there yet, this is clearly your sign to stop in for a delicious bite to eat.

Pepe's Mexican Restaurant opened its doors on September 27, 1994.

This year they celebrated 31 years in business! However, this was not the beginning of Joe Ayala's journey.

Mr. Ayala started 10 years earlier, as the

manager of Antonio's, a Mexican restaurant in the same location where Pepe's is today (117 S. 77 Sunshine Strip). In 1993, Antonio's relocated, opening a larger location, where Joe continued to manage for one more year before moving back to his old stomping grounds. This time as an owner. He acquired the building where he

once managed, dusted it off, gave it a new name, and jumped right back in the saddle.

For Joe, less is more. He's kept the restaurant small and cozy, the menu the same. He's stuck to recipes that were tried and true. Plates that customers know and still order till this day. When I asked him what the secret was, he said "consistency," and I

could not agree more.

A big part of that starts in the kitchen. We will get into the food in just a second, but I would be remiss to not mention that the head chef has been with Joe for 39 years. This explains that consistency that we all love. It doesn't stop there; the wait staff has some amazing guys that have been there for 25 years.

Now let's get into the food. For starters, the chips and salsa: five stars! Ok, ok, at least in my opinion. However, I'm pretty sure I'm not alone on this one. As a matter of fact, I know a few people who dine in regularly just because of them.

Second, the fajitas! I'm positive I'm not alone on this one because not only has the restaurant and waitstaff been named the Valley Morning Star Readers' Choice multiple times but so have those famous fajitas. They have also been named best overall Mexican food and have been featured in magazines, state and Valleywide.

The menu is full of wonderful choices. My personal favorite is the botana for two. It's perfect for sharing and easy to customize.

It's served on a bed of cheesy nachos with guacamole, topped with fajitas of your choice, a side of rice and beans, and tortillas, which are all delicious. On the lighter side, they also have a great jalapeño soup or mini crispy tacos that are super savory.

Pepe's offers great food and great service. It's no wonder it's been around long enough for it to become part of our family traditions. Mr. Ayala knows many of us by name, and has watched families grow up, move, come back, and start families of their own. He loves his job. What he cherishes the most are his customers. He is forever grateful for the loyalty the community of Harlingen has offered his business.

I asked Joe about the future of Pepe's and what advice he would give up-and-coming restauranteurs. He assured me that for as long as he's around, he will be here, and that he knows the crew who have been with him

through thick and thin will keep it going long after. For the second part of my question, his advice was "keep it simple."

"I'm very proud to be able to bring things like this to the Valley," he said.


Viola Garza, co-owner of J&V's Toys, Games and More feels similarly about the convention.

"This is something we like to do and we like to share with the communitywhat better than here in Harlingen, our beloved Harlingen," she said.



"A big part of our support comes from... fundraising and purchasing of things that the band needs, whether it be equipment or meals or things like that. But we do everything you can think of—from

handing out water after performances, providing moral support, even washing uniforms. Anything the band needs, we are there to support them the whole way."

What truly sets this group a part, Echon believes, is the dedication of its members. "Everyone in the organization is very dedicated to the band and to the kids. They're putting in tons of volunteer hours to help the band with

whatever they need. I can't even count how many hours we put in, but the parents and their dedication really make it unique."

This year, the boosters are stepping up their efforts with their first ever Mighty Hawks Band Boosters Fundraiser Golf Tournament. "The usual fundraisers are great," Echon says, "but this year, we wanted to have an event that really brings the community together.

Funds raised during the tournament will help cover essential needs for the band throughout the year, including meals, travel expenses, props for performances, and clinician costs. "We don't have a specific target for the funds right now—we're trying to get a leg up on next year."

Beyond playing in the tournament, community members can support in many ways. "We're always looking for

volunteers," Echon shares. "Donations are always welcome. If you go to our website, there's a bunch of info on how to contact us and ways you can get involved."

Volunteer support plays a crucial role in making the event a success. "Since we're going to have so many contests and events going on that day, we just need a lot of hands to make sure everything goes smoothly," he says. "All hands on deck."

Echon hopes the community understands the lasting impact of their support. "Whether you're playing in the tournament, cheering from the sidelines, or participating in the golf ball drop, any support is going a long way to helping these kids become better students, better musicians, just better all around. We really appreciate everything you guys are doing."

## The Band'itos – the Month A Staple in the Harlingen Music Scene

Familiar melodic tunes of the 80s, 90s, and 2000s drift into the night as the door at Station 1 Bar & Grill in Harlingen opens on a Friday. The setup? An acoustic guitar and a drum set. While that may sound minimal, The Band'itos' music is anything but. Dynamic strumming, powerful vocals and drumming that makes the kit sing and drives the song forward, keeps the ambience of the place light, cheerful, and energetic.

The band, which started as a 3-piece in 2022, stays busy

with gigs at places such as Station 1, The 83 Winery, and Sir's Martini Lounge.

Gilbert Elizondo, the guitarist and vocalist of the band, says they stay in and around the Harlingen area.

"It keeps us very busy," he said.

Norman White, drummer and backup vocalist, and Elizondo both mention that the feedback they've been getting has been positive. They recently went from being a "loud rock band" as Elizondo describes it, to "not so loud" having gone from three members to two about two months ago and shifting to an acoustic

sound.

White remembers Elizondo asking for more acoustic-driven songs in the past.

"We just never did it," White said.

"You never wanted to," Elizondo responds playfully. "And now he likes it."

This shift has allowed the band to be more

creative with their song choices and has expanded their set list as well.

"It's been neat because we will be like hey, let's try this song and we can kind of make it our own," Elizondo said. "It gives a little bit more flexibility."

Both have been part of the music scene for

decades and are multiinstrumentalists with White having started off as a guitarist before getting into the drums.

"My mom was a guitar player, and she played country music in a band, so she kind of taught me some chords and that's where I kind of started," he said. "She's the one that got me started."

He found his way to the drums in the early 90s while playing for different bands in the area. He was part of an all original metal band, Inner Sanctum, which was popular in the Rio Grande Valley.

Elizondo started playing guitar when he was a sophomore in high school and was self-taught. His dad was also a musician and that had an influence on him.

"My dad used to play the piano a lot and he's the one that got me interested in playing something... the piano to me, it didn't make any sense, but the guitar made sense," he said.

He has played and recorded with different bands as a musician not only in Harlingen but in the Dallas area where he moved to in 1998. He made his way back to Harlingen before the COVID-19 pandemic.

Their combined years of experience, the dynamic of the members, and their intentional song choice to keep it varied for the audience, have made them a staple at Station 1 on Fridays.

Even though they're known as a cover band, they are open to the idea of one day creating original music together.

"The possibility is there. I don't see why not," Elizondo said. "It's so much easier nowadays to write and record."

At the end of the day, the band enjoys keeping the crowd going with the tunes they're familiar with as they unwind at their favorite

"It's fun entertaining people," White said.

"We'll probably both be doing it (playing music) well into our 60s and 70s. We'll probably be playing in some RV park somewhere," Elizondo said with a laugh.

For the 29th time in Harlingen High School South history, the Hawk Tennis program has been crowned Team Tennis District Champions. What an impressive accomplishment for a school that has been in existence for 32 years. This level of success and longevity is what all sports programs are trying to achieve and what athletes are looking to be part of.

I can't help but wonder how and why the Harlingen South Tennis program has been successful for so many years. What's the "secret sauce"?

I met with the recently recognized Texas **High School Coaches** Association Girls Tennis State Coach of the Year and South Hawks Tennis Head Coach, Ernesto Escamilla Jr., to congratulate him on another winning tennis season and to get insight into his program's history.

Coach Escamilla immediately gave credit to prior Hawks coaches

and players such as Coach Noe Stillman and his children, Tomas and Danielle Stillman, along with a slew of talented former Hawk Tennis players like Jeremiah Sanchez. Clearly, the South Hawk Tennis program has been blessed with great coaches and players who created the foundation and the winning culture. The challenge for Coach Escamilla is to continue the expectations to win and uphold the standard of success created by his predecessors.

Coach Ernesto Escamilla Jr. started his tenure as the South Hawks Tennis leader in 2019 but his journey to Harlingen South is unique and provides a real appreciation for the caliber of coach at the helm at Harlingen South.

Coach Escamilla is a Brownsville native who began his love for the sport of tennis at the Brownsville Tennis Center under the tutelage of Coach Rey Jasso and playing along with his good friend, Rafael Delgado. Coach



Jasso had experience playing tennis at the collegiate level and passed his wisdom to Coach Escamilla and his friend, Rafael. Rafael proceeded to play tennis at the collegiate level and continued to stay involved in the game after his competitive days were over. For Coach Ernesto Escamilla, he was interested in a physical therapy career and began his studies at the University of Texas – Brownsville

after concluding his competitive tennis career at Brownsville Pace High School.

It was his friend who unexpectedly contacted Coach Escamilla in 2010 to ask if he would be interested in being the **Assistant Tennis Coach** at Bethel University in Tennessee (Bethel TN). Coach Escamilla was about to propose to his girlfriend when this opportunity arose, and he wasn't quite sure if the timing was

right. After discussion with his new bride and his friend, who was the Head Tennis Coach at Bethel TN, Coach Escamilla accepted the position and began his career as a collegiate tennis coach. Coach Escamilla spent seven (7) years at Bethel TN serving three (3) years as an Assistant Coach and four (4) years as the Head Coach.

Coach Escamilla left Bethel TN in 2017 and became the women's

tennis coach at the University of Tennessee - Martin (UT Martin), a Division 1 program. Coach Escamilla remained at UT Martin until he departed in the Fall of 2019 to accept the Harlingen South Hawks Tennis Head Coach position. No doubt, Coach Escamilla's impressive tennis coaching resume, consisting of nine (9) years at the collegiate level, made him an exceptional selection

for this position, but it also provided the South Hawk Tennis program with a coach who has access to collegiate tennis contacts and ties across the United States to help his program and players.

Coach Escamilla's collegiate tennis coaching pedigree is impressive enough, but he knew that to get the Hawk Tennis program to the next level, he would have to surround himself with the best

staff. Coach Escamilla added Assistant Coaches Noe Moraida and Nick Sandlin, two proven and successful tennis coaches affiliated with the highly successful Los Fresnos High School tennis team, one serving as a former head coach. Coach Escamilla credits his Assistant Coaches greatly for the overall team success and is proud of how they work together to do what is best for the team and the players at

Harlingen South.

In addition to adding quality Assistant Coaches, Coach Escamilla indicated that the entire Harlingen tennis community in our beautiful city has been key to enhancing the success of the tennis programs and players at Harlingen South and Harlingen High. Coach Escamilla and Harlingen Cardinal Head Tennis Coach, Jay Tanamachi, have mutual respect and admiration for each other, their programs, and their success.

Coach Escamilla utilizes a "whole of community" approach and involves the amazing local tennis leaders to enhance his program like Ram Cuevas, the tennis pro at the HEB Tennis Center; Andy Carter, the tennis pro at the Harlingen Country Club; and former Hawk Head

Coach, Noe Stillman, serving as a private tennis coach in the Harlingen area. Coach Escamilla credits their involvement in our local tennis community as catalysts for success not only for his program but for the Hawks players.

For example, Harlingen South players volunteered at the annual USTA Pro Circuit tournament at the Harlingen Country Club and volunteered at the UT-RGV Western Athletic Conference Tennis Tournament held at the HEB Tennis Center last season. Coach Escamilla took the Hawks players to the Austin Open (a professional women's tournament) after competing in a tennis tournament in Round Rock, Texas. His intent is to expose Hawks



players to collegiate and professional tennis to help them with their overall growth and to showcase the opportunities available through the sport of tennis as they pursue their educational and career goals.

Coach Escamilla utilizes various methods to help his players succeed in tennis and in life and uses phrases like "Be the best you can be," "All In," "Together," and "Team Only" with his players. The program intentionally displays banners throughout their home tennis courts as constant reminders to their players, fans,

and opponents of the winning tradition and culture at Harlingen South.

In their history, the South Hawks Tennis program has had 28 Regional and 19 State qualifiers and two (2) State finalists. Although the South Hawks Tennis program has clearly experienced longterm success, Coach Escamilla is committed to every tennis player participating in his program. During Coach Escamilla's tenure, he has been blessed to coach players talented enough to compete at the collegiate level like Ethan Carter, Diego Garcia (Concordia

University), Jeremiah Sanchez (St. Mary's University), and Vicente Rodriguez (Kansas College). These South Hawks tennis alums remain engaged in the program and available as resources to the program and players.




